Chairman's Report

It is with great pleasure I write this report on behalf of Family & Friends Community Foundation Inc. The Foundation was formed in 2003 with an interim board and has progressed and developed into an organization of many diverse funds and areas of interest. Our cemetery committee (established in 2007) experienced a gratifying year. With continuing donated funds, both flow-through and endowment, we have been able to initiate some of our planned projects.

On June 11, at least 27 volunteers responded to our plea and renewed the cemetery with their helping hands for the coming season. It looked like the community cared! Holes were filled, headstones were straightened, gophers were trapped, grass was mowed, trees were trimmed, grass and leaves were raked.

Other projects we worked on throughout the season included:

- New measurements were taken for the three areas now designated as the East, Center & West sections.
- The East section is now measured and mapped for cremation only.
- A new map for the whole cemetery has been drawn up and copies are to be printed for those who require them.
- New plot markers have been made and installed in all sections, so more plots are now numbered and easy to find.
- Headstone information has been documented for the Heritage Website.
- "Meditation Area" was started
 - Benches were purchased and set up beside the visitor box.
 - Shrubs will be planted next spring, and the finishing touches will be added.

What is the goal of the LRC Committee?

The goal of the LRC is to support opportunities for young people to develop the skills and the character qualities that will prepare them to be healthy, contributing participants in our society.

What did the LRC Committee do in 2008?

1. Gathered information about the 40 developmental assets from Search Institute, a non-profit organization dedicated to the well-being and healthy development of all children and youth. They have developed the 40 *Developmental Assets*® which are concrete, common sense, positive experiences and qualities essential to raising successful young people. These assets have the power during critical adolescent years to influence choices young people make and help them become caring, responsible adults.

2. Committee members, Mable Mund and Cathy MacKenzie attended the workshop “Everyone’s an Asset Builder” in Yorkton, sponsored by Sunrise Health District.

3. On September 24th, the LRC Committee hosted the workshop, “Everyone’s An Asset Builder. The facilitator, Andrew Sedley, from Sunrise Health District, along with Alisa Leidl, principal of Churchbridge High School, introduced the 40 Developmental Assets to the large group of adult and youth participants. Everyone was encouraged to develop the assets in their personal and professional lives. The LRC Committee would like to express appreciation to Bill Johnston for bringing the assets to our communities by publishing practical suggestions for building assets in young people and to Mick Parmar, LHS principal, for promoting the assets through the “Eagle of the Month” program.



4. In 1996, the Institute launched a national **Healthy Communities • Healthy Youth (HC • HY)** initiative to support communities in their work in nurturing competent, caring and responsible children and adolescents and creating healthy communities for youth. In the summer of 2008, the LRC applied for the status of HC.HY for Churchbridge and Langenburg, with the cooperation of the businesses and the town councils in each community. We are pleased to announce that **the communities of Langenburg and Churchbridge are the first rural communities in Saskatchewan** to meet the HY-HC requirements which allow us to be involved in this network of communities which spans all of North America and to use the HC.HY logo.

Partners in Health Flow Through

Today or tomorrow if you walk into our Health Care Centre you will find a sense of renewal and optimism. The facilities are being modernized and improved. Morale of staff and residents is good.

Several years ago, the fact that these facilities were in trouble and becoming decrepit was brought to the Foundation's attention. The Foundation's answer to this was some immediate short term help. The long term help is a program called "PARTNERS IN HEALTH."

The principle behind Partners in Health (PIH) is to partner with any donation, large or small, or any organization, to help fund this renewal. PIH will match any donations on a 50% basis. e.g. A \$1000 gift would generate a \$500 contribution from the Foundation. Foundation funds come from what remains of the Langenburg Union Hospital fund.

The staff's answer to this is Quality of Life. This is a program started by Care Home staff and volunteers to make it more like home, the Eden concept.

The communities' answer to this was the First Annual Charity Golf Tournament. This committee of volunteers raised a large amount of money which was bolstered by Partners in Health. These funds were made available for health care projects on a priority basis and helped in the purchase of a new tub (\$33000) and new ambulance equipment.



Projects already completed or ongoing include:

- Health Care Complex bath renewal. The facility now has a whirlpool tub, a hydro sound tub and a bubble jet tub. The variety of baths provides the appropriate therapeutic benefit for residents and day care patients.
- Mobile sensory station to stimulate residents to keep them as active as possible.
- Provincial Government has also been providing funds for beds, lifts and a stretcher for the Health Care Complex.

In our lifelong battle for health we have a good first line of defense. Not perfect but not bad. We have coverage of a nurse practitioner and are a primary care facility. A nurse practitioner is combined with the services of a doctor, x-ray and blood work, physiotherapy, home care, baby clinics and more. Our ambulance and EMTs provide us with trauma control and emergency services. We have a 48 bed care home and family palliative suite.

Ongoing work includes a continuing appeal for donations large and small and the Second Annual Charity Golf Tournament. New projects include a summer gazebo fund for the north side of the Care Home.

Our communities are now responsible to help and support these facilities. Our women's auxiliaries of the past are not with us anymore. We all are the new auxiliary!

As chairman of this committee it is a pleasure to work with interested and enthusiastic people. Please help us to continue to succeed.

Palliative Flow Through

The Palliative Care Volunteer Team, an initiative of Family & Friends Community Foundation, provides support to those dealing with end of life issues in the communities of Churchbridge, Spy Hill, and Langenburg. The goal of the program is to complement the professional health care team by providing practical, social, emotional and spiritual support based on the needs of the patient and their family. Thanks to the support of Family & Friends Community Foundation the group was able to hire a volunteer coordinator for eight hours per week. The coordinator has been working with the Director of Volunteer Services at Sunrise Health Region to establish protocol regarding referrals. This past fall the program offered The Friend in Hand training program to new and existing volunteers. The program consists of eight sessions covering the topics: The Role of the Volunteer, Death and Dying: Myths, Attitudes and Beliefs, Listening and Responding, Comfort Measures, Spiritual Care of the Dying and their Families and Loss, Grief and Bereavement. This ongoing training ensures quality support for the terminally ill and their families from the palliative care volunteers. In November of 2008 the group formed a Charitable Unincorporated Association and elected the group's first executive: Don Wyand (Langenburg), Chairperson, Lois Smandych (Bredenbury), Vice-Chairperson and Wanda Thorpe (Spy Hill), Secretary.

Palliative Care Room Project Flow Through

Thanks to a number of memorial donations, this family room located next to the palliative room in the Centennial Special Care Home will provide comfort for the individual and families dealing with end of life issues.
